

2017 Glencoe Beach Season Pass

Frequently Asked Questions

1. How can I purchase a 2017 Beach Season Pass?

A photo is required for each household member who is purchasing a pass. You may purchase your beach pass two ways:

- Fast Track Purchase: Come to the Takiff Center (999 Green Bay Road), during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:30 am to 5:00 pm, or during the extended dates/times to purchase your pass and take photos of everyone in your household:
 - Saturday, May 6: 10 AM-3 PM
 - Sunday, May 7: 10 AM-3 PM
 - Monday, May 8: 8:30 AM-8 PM
 - Tuesday, May 9: 8:30 AM-8 PM
 - Wednesday, May 24: 8:30 AM-8 PM
 - Thursday, May 25: 8:30 AM-8 PM
 - Friday, May 26: 8:30 AM-8 PM
- Avoid the Lines: Download our Beach Pass registration form online, complete the form and either fax it, mail it in, or drop it off at the Takiff Center before May 9 to lock in the Early Bird Rate. When you receive an email confirmation receipt that your Beach Pass registration form has been processed, you and your family members can come into the Takiff Center to take photos and pick-up your pass. Photos can be taken anytime the Takiff Center or Glencoe Beach is open. We accept Visa, MasterCard, check or cash. Please see our brochure, or go to our website for fees and additional information.

2. What is required when registering for this pass?

If you are new to the area or a non-resident purchasing a season pass for the first time, you must first create a household account online at www.glencoeparkdistrict.com or in-person at the Glencoe Park District Takiff Center (located at 999 Green Bay Road) during normal business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:30 am to 5:00 pm.

3. What dates and times may I come in to the Takiff Center with my family members to take photos and/or purchase Beach Season Passes? Avoid the long lines at the Beach... come into the Takiff Community Center before the Beach opens! Anytime the Takiff Center is open, you can fill out a beach pass registration form and take your photo.



- 4. Why is the Park District doing away with the plastic token? Rather than receiving a plastic token, you will receive a barcoded Beach Pass. This is a universal pass that can also be used to register for our Watts Ice Rink, and/or certain fitness classes. This is a technology upgrade for an overall better user experience, and to allow the Park District to collect beach usage data. More importantly, since these passes are less expensive, the Park District will be able to pass the savings on to our patrons. If you've already received the barcoded pass for Watts or fitness, you will not receive an additional one.
- 5. Should I discard this barcoded pass at the end of the season? No, this is the only pass you will receive. You will be able to use your barcoded pass to renew your Beach Season Pass each year and to register for a Watts Ice Rink pass and/or certain fitness classes.
